

# Summary of approach

This summary shares how we approached collecting data for the tenant perception measures.

## Number of responses

337. Local Space is required to complete a minimum of 317 surveys in 2025-26.

A random sampling approach was used where customers had an equal and fair chance of being invited to participate. We have ensured that the customers surveyed reflect our full customer population.

## Survey duration

Monthly from 2 April 2025 to 16 March 2026.

## Collection method

Telephone interviews.

## External contractor commissioned to carry out research

IFF Research.

## Additional survey questions

We asked 37 questions in total. These included the questions required by the Regulator of Social Housing, questions to capture equality, diversity and inclusion data (with an option for residents to opt out of sharing this information with us) and these additional questions:

- Why do you say that? (Relating to overall satisfaction and building safety questions).
- Generally, how satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way Local Space deals with repairs and maintenance?
- How satisfied or dissatisfied are you that Local Space is easy to deal with?
- How strongly would you agree or disagree with the following statement, "I trust Local Space to do what they say they will do"?
- Have you reported antisocial behaviour to Local Space in the last 12 months?

<p><b>Data representativeness</b></p>	<p>Tenant satisfaction survey results are important to us as it helps us to better understand our residents' needs so we can improve our homes, services and resident engagement.</p> <p>We are committed to ensuring that our research is representative. Each quarter, our research partners, IFF Research, conduct a detailed comparison between the achieved survey sample and the overall tenant population. This analysis is carried out across a range of demographic and property-related characteristics, including age, ethnicity, disability status, gender, property type, nationality, religion, sexual orientation, and our internal classification of properties by address and scheme.</p> <p>The representativeness assessment for the last financial year was encouraging, indicating that the sample reflected the wider tenant population well.</p> <p>Minor deviations between the sample and population could be attributed to the addition of new properties to the Local Space portfolio towards the end of the financial year in 2025–26, as well as ongoing efforts to enhance the completeness and accuracy of equality, diversity and inclusion data.</p>
